- Pet owners may have better cardiovascular health Having a pet appears to lower the risk of developing high blood pressure and may improve blood pressure control in people who already have the condition.² Plus, on average, people who own dogs walk 20 minutes more per day than those who don't.²
- Pets also offer positive benefits for children Studies have shown that regular interactions with dogs can lead to lower stress in children, including neurodiverse children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD).³
- Pets keep people connected Many conversations can begin with a daily pet walk or a trip to the dog park. If you live alone, a pet may be helpful for companionship and expanding your social circle.²
